
...A TROPICAL STORM WARNING REMAINS IN EFFECT FOR PUERTO RICO AND THE U.S. VIRGIN ISLANDS... ...A FLASH FLOOD WATCH REMAINS IN EFFECT FOR PUERTO RICO AND THE U.S. VIRGIN ISLANDS FROM TUESDAY EVENING THROUGH THURSDAY MORNING...

- **OVERALL: Tropical Storm Ernesto** is located about **350** miles of Puerto Rico and **10** miles of Guadalupe.
- INTENSITY FORECAST: This system currently has maximum sustained winds around 40 mph and is forecast to remain at tropical storm force as it affects the region.
- TRACK FORECAST: Based on the latest forecast track, this system is moving W at 20 mph and it is expected to reach the REGION by TUESDAY EVENING, moving near eastern Puerto Rico and in the vicinity of the Virgin Islands.
- PHASE MESSAGE: Given the latest forecast track and intensity, now is an opportune moment to finalize preparatory measures for a potential direct or indirect impact from this system.





Some damage to roofing and siding materials, along with damage to porches, awnings, carports, and sheds. A few buildings experiencing window, door, and garage door failures. Mobile homes damaged, especially if unanchored. Unsecured lightweight objects become dangerous


Several large trees snapped or uprooted, but with greater numbers in places where trees are shallow rooted. Several fences and roadway signs blown over.

Some roads impassable from large debris, and more within urban or heavily wooded places. A few bridges, causeways, and access routes impassable.

Scattered power and communications outages, but more prevalent in areas with above ground lines.



Surface Wind Field




Tropical-Storm-Force winds extend up to 70 miles from the center.



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Tropical-Storm-Force Wind Speed Probabilities





50-knot (58 mph) Wind Speed Probabilities




50-knot-force wind speed






Rivers and tributaries may rapidly overflow their banks in multiple places. Small streams, creeks, canals, arroyos, and ditches may become dangerous rivers. In mountain areas, destructive runoff along steep terrain will result in many rockslides and landslides. Flood control systems and barriers

Flood waters can enter many structures within multiple communities, some structures becoming uninhabitable or washed away. Many places where flood waters may cover escape routes. Streets and parking lots become rivers of moving water with underpasses submerged. Driving conditions become dangerous. Many road and bridge closures with some weakened or washed out.




